Line of Reasoning

° Uniformly offer evidence to support claims.

- Focus on the importance of specific words and details from the passage to build an interpretation.
- Organize and support an argument as a line of reasoning composed of multiple supporting claims, each with adequate evidence that is clearly explained.
- Explain how the writer's use of multiple literary techniques contributes to the student's interpretation of the passage.

Claim – Arun's discomfort contrasts with his host family

- Arun is uncomfortable
- ° Arun would rather be working
- ° Arun prefers to town to nature
- ° Arun feels in danger when out in the woods
- ° Arun and Melanie are awkward towards each other
- Arun concedes to his host mother, despite disagreeing with her
- ° Arun continues to serve his host mother, even though he doesn't want to be outside

But what would be a line of reasoning?

- ° Claim: Arun's discomfort contrasts with his host family
- ° Possible lines of reasoning:
- Arun's discomfort with his host family <u>demonstrates</u> the ongoing tensions felt by immigrants in America.
- The contrast between Mrs. Patton and Arun juxtaposes her modern, American mindset with his foreign, Indian one.
- Arun's discomfort in the woods <u>establishes</u> his alienation in America and within his host family's lives.

Claim = isolated argument Line of reasoning = big picture argument

- Line of reasoning: Arun's discomfort in the woods establishes his alienation in America and within his host family's lives.
 - Tensions upon being told he's going to the beach (diction, characterization)
 - "Arun cannot plead work"
 - "No, no, no."

• Awkwardness with Melanie and Mrs. Patton (contrast)

- ° "try to find a way to walk that will not compel them to be side by side"
- "Who is to follow whom?"

• Feeling of danger in the forest (imagery)

- "shrill" of cicadas
- "ugly, jarring note that does not vary."
- ° "Arun finds the hair on the back of his neck begin to prickle, as if in warning."
- "The town may be small and have little to offer, but how passionately he prefers [it]...to this creeping curtain of insidious green."

• Conclusion: Why does this matter? Hammer home the line of reasoning

• We can see that for Arun, this is no simple trip to the beach. His perspective demonstrates the onslaught of confusion and discomfort felt by anyone in a new and foreign setting.
